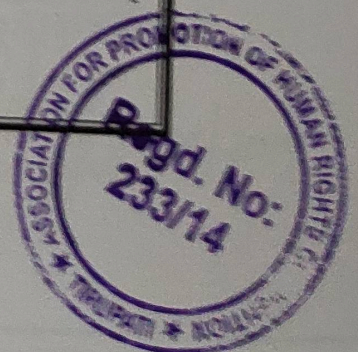

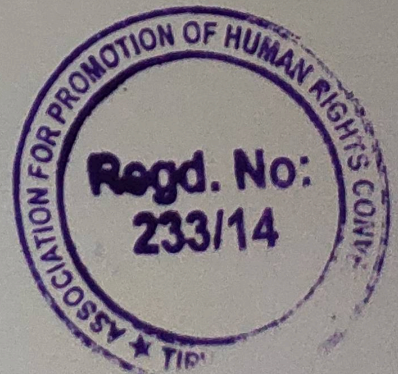

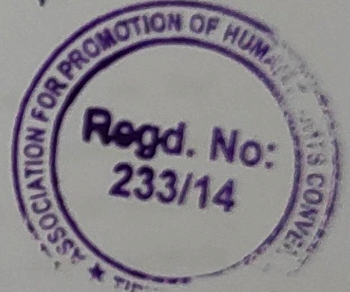

ANNUAL ACTIVITY REPORT OF 2018-19

ASSOCIATION FOR PROMOTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS CONVENTION organized the programs in the villages of Tirupati rural and urban mandals, Chittoor district, Andhra Pradesh, India. The awareness, workshops, agriculture trainings, relief services and women skills trainings were organized in working area for the target groups/communities. The programmes were conducted with member's contribution and local donations. The following activities were conducted during 2018-19.

**AWARENESS PROGRAMS .**

**Environment awareness camps.**

In rural area the farmers burn the crop residues to clean the field for next crop. The burning of biomass release carbon dioxide into atmosphere. The accumulation of CO<sub>2</sub> in the atmosphere main reason for global warming. Hence the trainings were conducted to farmers to use the farm waste for compost making instead of burning. At the same they were training in greenery to reduce the CO<sub>2</sub> in the atmosphere.

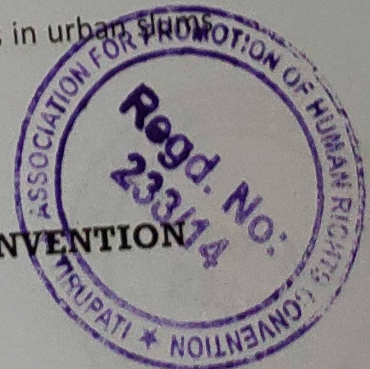
**Women legal awareness camps.**

The awareness camps were organized for rural women to educate them on the legal

rights. They were educated on law relating women discrimination, exploitation and violence against women. The dory prohibition Act, domestic violence prevention Act, women trafficking, harassment at work place were discussed in the camps. The IPC and Indian evidence Act, FIR and bail were explained to them.

**Health and sanitation awareness camps**  
90% of communicable diseases are caused by poor hygiene and sanitation. The poor sanitation affect not only individual households but also public health. Hence the awareness camps were conducted for women and SHG members in urban slums

and rural area to protect the communities from diseases. The awareness was created on personal, domestic and environment hygiene, proper management of solid and water domestic waste, maintenance of sanitary latrines by frequent and cleaning and sprinkling infectants.

### Women Awareness on child rights

The awareness camps were conducted to women to create awareness on right rights such as survival right, development right, protection rights and participation rights. The birth registration, immunization and nutrition food come under the survival right, the education comes under development right, the child protection from exploitation and discrimination come under protection right and child participation decision making comes under participation right.

### Awareness on drinking water

The awareness camps were organized to women on drinking water. The women were educated on the safe drinking water, water pollution, water borne diseases, low cost water purification technology and water bodies protection, judicial use of waste etc. .

### WORKSHOPS ON WOMEN AND CHILD ISSUES

#### Workshop on domestic violence.

One day workshop was organized on domestic violence. The students, researchers, NGOs, women activists attended the workshop. The domestic violence Act was discussed in the workshop hours. The participants identified the key issues and recommended the remedies.

#### Workshop on women harassment at workplace

One day workshop was organized on the women harassment at work place. The students, researchers, NGOs, women activists attended the workshop. The Act on women harassment at work place and enforcement, free legal aid services of Government, online complaints to women commissions and backlogs in implementation of law were discussed in the workshop sessions. The participants identified the key issues and recommended the remedies.

#### Workshop on child rights.

The workshop was organized to discuss on the child rights ensures in CRC; right of survival, development, protection and participation and National policy on child. The Government has formulated the child

development schemes as a signed party child convention. The implementation of policy and schemes were discussed. The NGOs, students, researchers and officers of line departments participated and contributed their views.

### RELIEF PROGRAMMES

#### Nutrition support to HIV infected children.

The persons infected with HIV/AIDS need to take the tablets and strong diet to tolerate the tablet intake and increase immunity for prolonging life. But the poor persons infected with HIV/AIDS neglect both tablets and nutritional diet due to poverty. The infected children are vulnerable to this risk. Hence our association provided the nutritional diet to children infected with HIV/AIDS

#### Rehabilitation to street children.

The street children lack night shelter, they sleep on platforms, under railway bridge and in bus stands. Hence the association provided night shelter home for stay in the night times. The shelter home provided the night meal and bedding material and water and toilets.

### AGRICULTURE TRAININGS

#### Organic farming

The small and marginal farmers were provided training in organic farming methods for sustainable yield and income through low cost natural methods. The training was given in adverse effects of the chemical farming and advantages of the organic farming. The specific training was given on bio-fertilizers, bio-pesticides, non-pesticide management in insects and pest killing. The soil and moisture conservation was taught in the trainings.
